IFAA Annual General Meeting Minutes

1. Meeting opening and welcome (President John Heywood)

2. Previous meeting minutes to be approved

- The previous AGM was 25 October 2023.
- The 2024 General Meeting was held on 13th Nov 2024 to discuss the boat rule changes.
John Heywood Proposed accepting both sets of minutes,
Seconded by Myles Gavin.
Motion passed unanimously.

3. Business arising from AGM and Rule change Minutes

- World Championship results showed a mix of the boats designed based on the new rules. The teams' results were across the fleet similar to what they experienced in their previous boats. Thus it appears the objective of modernising the cockpit and controls while keeping the same hull performance has been achieved.
- 2nd hand boat sales have been continuing and we are running short of good options in Australia. Ben is updating his existing YMS to retro-fit some of the same control systems as the new boats.

4. Reports:

4.1. President

IFAA President's Report 2025

As we launched into the 2024-25 season there was excitement about the prospect of sailing at Lake Garda. Several new teams purchased boats and were participating in events.

Unusual weather plagued the 2024-25 season. Fireballs were fortunate comparatively, in that we managed to get regattas completed, but two events in our calendar were completed with only 2 races:

- The National Championship at Eden, in Feb 2025, was the most disappointing in this regard, with 2 very light races completed on day 2. Days 1, 3 and 4 were blown out with no racing. Tom Gillard and Andy Thompson won after well calculated tactics saw them come back from mid fleet to the front in race 1. The name of their boat that they bought after the 2024 World Championship

stayed in the theme of “Expensive Event”! Brendan Garner and Ben O’Brien sailed very consistently to take out the Australian Champion title, finishing just behind Tom and Andy overall.

- The Cairn Curran Sailing Club - one of the IFAV iconic country camping events was also completed with only 2 races in November 2024. It included a weird mini-tornado that ripped along the water line picking up and throwing boats in the process of launching around. It was less than a 20m wide path of devastation! Tents 50m up the hill were fine - go figure!
Then on day 2 of the regatta - no wind!

State Titles held in Victoria and South Australia had better luck with the weather and created a good meeting point for fleets to get together.

Victorian States, sailed bayside at Sandringham Yacht Club saw some very tight competition. Countback was required to separate 1st and 2nd place with Heather Macfarlane / Chris Payne winning from Sophie Jackson / Andrew Perry.

South Australian State Titles were sailed across 2 weekends at Adelaide Sailing Club in November 2024 and Brighton Seacliff Yacht Club in March 2025. Small fleets and tight competition saw racing go down to the wire and the experience sailing together plus time on the water saw Jalina Pivetta (née Thompson-Kambas) / Nathan Stockley take out the title from up and coming team Jess De La Perrelle and James Gaskell.

Focus of IFAA for 2025 was #MFSMO: More Fireballs Sailing More Often.

Many sailors contributed to generating social media posts incorporating [#MFSMO](#). Top contributors ranged from Lyndon Zimmerman who was new to the class in SA at the start of the season through to the winner and now seasoned fireball sailor Jaemie Wilson.

The final event of the season was the Inaugural Fireball Youth National Championship held in conjunction with the Yachting Victoria Western Region Easter Regatta at Lake Bullen Merri. Of the 18 fireballs competing from 3 different states, 10 were Youth teams. Camping together was great fun. The weather was kind with each of the 3 days having different wind conditions, covering light air to strong breezes.

Youth Nationals Results were as follows:

- 1st Josh Garner / Ben O'Brien
- 2nd Calin Went / Chris Went
- 3rd Ben Garner / Sam Williamson - 1st Double Youth
- 4th Ben Schulz / Matilda Schulz
- 5th Charley Stevens / Will Farnell - 2nd Double Youth
- 6th Imogen Farnell / Finn Buckley - 3rd Double Youth

We hope to see most if not all of these teams in fireballs more regularly and welcome the fun they bring to the regatta. The 2nd Youth National Championship is at Indented Head on 21st and 22nd March 2026.

To conclude, 2024-25 was a successful season, in terms of interest levels with a moderate level of translation to sailors on the water. The interest generated from the Geelong World Championships and the translation of that interest into 17 Aussie boats competing at Lake Garda in the 2025 World Championships is exciting. Based on the social media reports the majority of Aussie participants in Garda took the opportunity to add fantastic holidays to their Worlds participation. Please continue to

support the class by attending the events, contributing on social media and engaging with newer members at your club at events and on social media.

I hope to see you all at the Nationals in Adelaide on Monday 2nd Feb - Friday 6th Feb in 2026!

4.2. Treasurer

IFAA Treasurer's Report Year ending 30 June 2025

The 2025 year has predominantly been spent accounting for money going in and out of the account for the team travelling to Lake Garda.

To date \$46,563 has come into the account from team members and subsidies from FI. Outgoings for the container came to \$29,875.55, leaving \$16,687.45 being held in trust to go towards the costs of return shipping from Italy.

The container is due back to Australia at the end of November so soon after this date the trip accounts can be settled and any remaining funds returned to team members. Of note in the income for the association, is a one off item of \$1,200 or \$100 per boat for container frame hire. This will help cover any maintenance on the frames required before the next trip – hopefully Kenya early 2028.

IFAA paid for a promotional video utilising footage from the Geelong worlds. The fee for this was \$990, of which \$514.86 was reimbursed by Fireball International.

For the 2025 year IFAA has a book profit of \$582.79.

If we remove the one off income from the container and the net outlay for the promotional video the result from ordinary operations is a loss of \$142.07

It is anticipated that 2026 subscriptions will be similar or slightly higher than 2025. Many boats have changed hands and hopefully the new owners will become members of the association.

Insurance continues to rise each year and is by far our largest expense. We may need to assess in the future whether it is worthwhile maintaining this insurance.

At this point in time I recommend that membership fees remain the same at \$30 per person and \$40 per boat.

4.3. Measurer

Measurers Report 29 October 2025

After all the work to run the measurement process for the worlds in Geelong, this last year was very quiet with just minimal checking at the Australian Title at Eden.

I also look after the administration of the measurement process that mainly revolves around the change of the measurement certificate, when a boat changes ownership. We have had some change of ownerships this year and it's important that whenever a boat is sold the change of ownership form is completed. You won't be able to compete in a title event without a measurement certificate in the owner's name .

It was surprising to me the amount of boats that failed measurement at the last worlds and we should aim to have the Australian Fireballs conforming to the one design rules and then making the measurement process straight forward.

4.5. IFAV Report

IFAV Report 2024-25 Season

The 2024/25 Season was a successful season given the previous season hosted a Worlds. The usual post Worlds slump in the class did not happen, and there were a number of events well run and well attended.

STATE TITLES 24/25 _ Sail Sandy Regatta 19-20 October 2024

The IFAV Victorian State Titles were held at the Sandringham Yacht Club as part of the Sail Sandy regatta across the weekend of 19/20 October 2024. There were 10 Fireballs entered with 7 competing in the regatta. Eight races were completed across the weekend with windy and challenging conditions on the Saturday and light winds on the Sunday. Congratulations to Heather and Chris Payne for winning another State Title to add to the multitude they have won previously. Commiserations to Sophie Jackson and Andrew Perry who placed second on a count back. There may have been some gear failure that contributed to this, and congratulations to Brendan Garner and Ben O'Brien for placing third.

Thank you to the Sandringham Yacht Club for hosting this regatta. Sandringham have continued to invite us to the Sail Sandy Regatta and would like to see Fireballs present at future regattas.

The scheduling of the State Title this early in the season was not ideal and along with the weather probably contributed to the lower turnout than we had hoped. It's possible the venue contributed somewhat to this as well. In planning this regatta the criteria was to have it in the first half of the season, in an already organised regatta, and preferably on the Eastern side of Port Phillip bay. These criteria were somewhat dictated by other events this season and are not the same going from season to season.
